Hi All!

My name is Meredith Haynes and I am honored and humbled to be Ohio President for this next year! This year's theme is "Preserving Our Past and Building Our Future" as we raise funds to support the Ohio History Connection.

Ohio History Connection is an organization that works to preserve museums and other places of historical importance all across the buckeye state. OHC is responsible for the upkeep of 58 historic sites/museums within 40 of Ohio's 88 counties.

The breakdown of this is 33 historical sites, 4 natural history sites, 12 museums, 5,000 acres of land, 9 archeological sites, 300 buildings built between 1788-2013, 8 canal locks, 4 major bridges, and 2 boats.

As state president, I believe that there is nothing more important than remembering our past, so that we can honor it better! Ohio History Connection is an organization that believes strongly that history must be well kept and shared among Ohio citizens, beginning with children. Some of the ways they carry out this mission is by educating children with online lessons they create to be used in classrooms.


#### MIAMISBURG MOUND

The Adena American Indian Mound is one of the largest conical mounds in Eastern North America. Excavations made in 1869 showed that the mound was built in several stages over a period of time, there is a layer of stone slabs layered like shingles 24 feet below the surface, showing that the mound once had a stone outside!


#### **FALL EVENT-SAVE THE DATE!**


